

CEC.P.15: FREQUENCY OF WRITING/REWRITING THE NATIONAL OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY CERTIFICATION EXAMINATION

Activity Sphere: Standards Activity: Examination Subactivity/task: Rewriting the examination Last Revised: November 2018

POLICY

The Certification Examination is offered on two occasions each year. The Canadian Association of Occupational Therapists determines the location and dates of the examination.

Eligible candidates are permitted a maximum of three (3) attempts to successfully complete the National Occupational Therapy Certification Examination.

PROCEDURES

- 1. Effective October 1, 2014, all existing candidates who have written the NOTCE in the past will be able to write a maximum of three (3) times, regardless of the attempts that took place prior to this policy subject to the regulator's approval of eligibility.
- 2. The Exam and Accreditation Officer will alert the exam writer about a third and final attempt.
- 3. The candidate would be granted an additional three attempts upon completion of a new entry to practice occupational therapy program that is approved by the regulator.
